

French at Kyklos

THE Theresa French exhibition opens tomorrow, Saturday October 5, at 7.30pm and continues until the 15th at Kyklos, Paphos.

The artist was born in Devon and educated in Bath.

After many years of teaching Art and Craft in English schools, she retired in 1983 and then had two solo exhibitions in Cambridgeshire before coming to live in Yeroskipou in 1991.

Here she has had solo exhibitions at Kyklos and the Coral Beach Hotel, and contributed to the Cultural Festival exhibition at the Melina Mercouri in Nicosia 2000.

Theresa also produces her own greeting cards and prints; some of her first designs were for the Medici Society in

London.

Her other interests are music, bridge, swimming and travel.

This year she made a pilgrimage to Italy visiting Rome, Assisi, Venice, Vincenza and the Dolomites, after which she spent some time near Geneva and went to Paris to revisit favourite galleries and sites.

Many of her paintings are owned by private collectors in Cyprus and worldwide.

Always known as a painter of flowers, her work delights those who enjoy images which combine botanical authenticity with vibrant colour.

Paintings this year range from flower and still life compositions to the complexities of landscape.

address by Mayor Michalakis Zampelas, followed by the inauguration by Ouranios Ioannides, Minister of Education and Culture.


Shortly after the
